

Review of: "[Review Article] Nanocarriers for Protein and Peptide Drug Delivery"

It is a pleasure for me to read and review the review article. Kindly find my comments below:

"The manuscript submitted for review entitled "[Review Article] Nanocarriers for Protein and Peptide Drug Delivery" is intended to be a review article describing the latest achievements in the field of nanotechnology in the release of Protein and Peptide Drugs. Unfortunately, in my opinion, such an ambitious topic cannot be presented even briefly on about nine typescript pages. The manuscript presented in the sent form is not suitable for publishing. This is not a review article, but a form of short note. I cannot recommend this article in its present form for publishing. Therefore, in my opinion, it requires a few major treatments.

- 1. They contain neither a detailed analysis of the literature presented so far on this topic- oriented in line with the guiding idea, nor the latest achievements and scientific revelations.
- 2. English grammar is very poor and not acceptable for publishing in such a form. There are several grammatical mistakes in the whole manuscript.
- 3. The title of the manuscript is "Nanocarriers for Protein and Peptide Drug Delivery" Then why the authors are describing the "microsphere" and "microemulsion" in the abstract and remaining manuscript portion? Remove it.
- 4. The authors have not addressed the references in the figures and table sections.
- 5. The authors have given only general principles of nanoparticles in the article. However, they have given no particular examples of how they have formed the nanoparticles by using what materials. They have also not explained which protein and peptide drug was loaded in the nanoparticle, the route of administration, and targeted/treated diseases. They have also not addressed any references in the manuscript.

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
