

Review of: "Why Corruption in Nigeria? Experts' Accounts on the Occurrences and Persistence"

This paper seeks to evaluate corruption in Nigeria through qualitative analysis. To do this, he interviewed 24 experts from anti-corruption agencies. Based on the responses, it points out that corruption in Nigeria originates from factors associated with economic incentives, low justice penalties and some cultural practices.

The study should show more data about the magnitude of the corruption problem in Nigeria. What are the estimates of resource losses as a % of GDP due to corruption?. What data does Transparency International handle on Nigeria's ranking in corruption worldwide?

The study could also explore a Structural Equation Analysis (SEM) to empirically verify the greatest determinant of corruption based on the surveys carried out.
