

Review of: "Resentment and Multiculturalism: Kymlicka's Canada, Bonilla Maldonado's Colombia and Modood's UK"

This is an important and timely contribution to scholarship about culture and belonging. Kymlicka's approach is successfully compared with Maldono and Héctor Alonso Moreno Parra foregrounding the Colombian multicultural Constitution but drawing out similarities and differences with Modood's work on multiculturalism in minorities in the UK. What is particularly useful is the inclusion of the impact of resentment in the dynamic of migration and comparisons with the Canadian context in Saunders' presentation of the situation of migrants in slums and suburbs which emphasizes the relationship between economic well-being and multiculturalism. As an applied linguist, this will be an important contribution to interdisciplinary scholarship about culture, identity and belonging.
