- 1. Actually, this issue is interesting, but if the author wants to study it, it is very broad because it covers 21 project themes, so it is recommended to focus on certain issues only.
- 2. The substance in the abstract is contradictory to the content of the writing.
- 3. There is no explanation regarding the background to the issuance of this Presidential Regulation in the introduction, even though this is very important.
- 4. The research methodology was not found, so it is difficult to understand how the author obtained the required legal materials.
- 5. This article is not clear because it does not present the legal issues that are the basis for discussion and analysis, which shows the conflict between legal norms, namely Presidential Regulation Number 120 of 2022, and the facts in the field, whether it is true that the provisions in this regulation have caused human rights violations.
- 6. In this article, the author, among other things, only stated that there are possible violations of the right to welfare in the form of seizure or confiscation of land, and other risks that will endanger the health of the community. However, this was later contradicted by the author's statement that in this regulation, there are specific requirements that can guarantee that the Presidential regulation will not give rise to legal problems. No analysis of the problems presented using relevant legal theories was provided.
- 7. If the author wants to question who should be responsible for compliance with this rule, the author can examine it from the aspect of its legal structure.
