RESULTS

This is a good research; however, upon successful perusal of the article with the title "Decentralization - The Fundamental Challenge in Pakistan: The Decentralization of Health Care," the following highlighted points can be deduced:-

1. Strengths:

- The author highlights the limitations of the study, noting that it only focuses on public health in Sindh province;
- The article highlights the need for targeted policies to alter the cultures of healthcare organisations;
- It gives a succinct overview of the 18th Amendment to the Pakistani Constitution and its impact on the health sector; and
- It addresses a significant issue in Pakistan's healthcare system, namely the decentralisation of healthcare and its challenges.

2. Weaknesses:

- The article does not have an introduction. There is a need for a well-composed and detailed introduction.
- The author must endeavour to introduce and discuss what a health system is all about.
- The author should also highlight further facts or evidence such as case studies, statistics, or examples.
- For the article to sustain, the author needs to compare the situation of the health system with other countries.
- It's necessary to examine how decentralisation affects workforce planning, data accessibility, and decision-making procedures.
- Again, the author should look at or examine other strategies or models, nor does it discuss the possible benefits or drawbacks of decentralisation in the healthcare industry.

3. Opportunities for further research:

- •There is room for further research by looking at the complex relationships between different aspects of health care reform and offering more thorough understandings.
- •It is necessary for future studies to examine the origins, effects, and potential remedies for various medical conditions.
- •It might be more thoroughly investigated how external players, like the World Health Organisation, assist decentralisation



initiatives, as well as any possible drawbacks.

This article will benefit readers more if it is well researched, examined, and based on an evidential approach; further research would help to provide a more nuanced understanding of the problem.
