For instance, the article should provide more details on how brain patterns shape perceptual experiences and explain the limits of the impact of embodied actions on sensory perception. Additionally, it is recommended that the article conducts a more comprehensive literature review and establishes stronger connections with the existing enactivism literature.

In conclusion, this article presents a potentially valuable critical analysis, but there are some gaps that need to be addressed. The arguments presented in the article should be better supported, and a more extensive literature search should be conducted.
