

Review of: "Generic Competences in University Students from Barranquilla, Colombia"

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Potential competing interests: This is a relevant study and these are my suggestions: It seems to me that the authors did not see the reach of their study because they only described the results and did not analyze the implications and relevance of their findings. 1.- I suggest expanding the methodology, explaining its context with more precision. It is necessary to clarify how the study was applied, and to be more specific and analytical regarding the importance of the skills involved and their relevance directly to the profession. It would help to know what professions the interviewed students came from. It is necessary to group the skills with respect to their dimension: which are soft, which are cognitive, etc. It is also important to clarify what the difference between what is valued and what is developed means, and its implications. In this way, the work would not be limited to a descriptive study. With this information and the use of SSPS, a correlational analysis could be made for each profession. In addition, the sources are old, and there is a very extensive and newer bibliography for this subject. For example, there have already been UNSECO conferences on the subject more recent than the one they referred to. Finally, the conclusions offered by the authors do not emerge from their survey, but may be found in other international studies and policies.

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
