This manuscript, entitled "**Acacia pycnantha gum exudates recognised as a traditional food in two countries may have economic potential**," turns out to be a preliminary investigation of an interesting topic. However, it shows little relevant information about previous reviews of the references. For this reason, I will give my opinions regarding the improvements that the manuscript could have to improve significantly.

ABSTRACT

It is recommended to begin by adding the objective of the research. Since the title mentions that it is a review, I would place the words 'bibliography review' and 'preliminary investigations on the collection, use, sale, and effects of Accacia Gum.'

Within the keywords, some were added that, although they are mentioned in the article, do not correspond to its total context. In case you would like to align your work with the beneficial gastrointestinal functions or effects of the gum, I would recommend adding more information about studies of this.

INTRODUCTION

In the introduction, and because it is a review of the literature, I would recommend adding more information about previous studies.

MATERIALS

As I mentioned previously, this section would begin with a review of the literature and tables where the previous studies and their results are understood, in order to compare them with those obtained in the results section.

RESULTS

The results obtained are good; they just need to be handled and presented in more dynamic ways with graphs or comparisons.

I understand that the study is important; just the approach is not appropriate. Although rubber has not been treated as a food, in my perspective, the lack of information to society, the way it is collected, and the way it is presented is scarce.

The information obtained has potential and aspects for multidisciplinary studies. In my recommendation, I would not leave the topic; I would only improve it.
