

## Review of: "Bisphosphonate-Related Osteonecrosis of the Jaws Treated with Platelet-Rich Plasma: Preliminary Results from a Case Series"

The article described their new preparation B.P.F.C. Bio-Plasma® Rich in Pure Growth Factors®, which could restore an intact mucosa in BRONJ-affected patients. Major revision is suggested due to a lot of problems found in this article.

## Comments

- 1. In the procedure of Preparation of Plasma, the authors should describe more detailly, for example, the blood volume from the patients, the stock condition etc.
- 2. The description for the procedure should be more concise. It is quite confused by the following sentence "The 1 mL above the buffy coat, which presents the highest platelet and growth factor concentrations, was identified as fraction 2 (F2), whereas the next 2 mL above F1 was named fraction 1 (F1)." The total volume above buffy coat is 2 mL, so where is the 2 mL as F1 as claimed?
- 3. "A complete examination of the oral hard and soft tissues was carried out for each patient (Fig. 1)." Where is Figure 1 in this article???
- 4. In the result part, direct evidence such as pictures of the patients or data analysis is lacking. The result seems perfect but inconvincible.
- 5. The quality of the figures in this article is poor and not well-organized.
- 6. Further studies are necessary to validate these results with a larger sample size and a longer follow-up time.

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
