Overall there is no need of having separate abbreviation section, abbreviations can be stated in full, the first time they are mentioned in the text. The discussion section in the abstract should be replaced by Conclusion, as discussion is not part of the abstract

- 1. Title: The title should be modified as the the study does not indicate any clear strategy
- 2. Introduction: The implication of occult HBV infection should be added as well as the implication of having HBcAb positivity should be mentioned in the discussion
- 3. Methods: It is not clear as to when this study was conducted. Details on timeline of the study and duration should be added
- 4. Discussion: Majority of study participants were HBcAb positive regardless of HBsAg status. This aspect is mentioned in the discussion vaguely without clarity. Authors should add details on the clinical implication of this finding
