For example, it is also good if the aim of the study is presented under a separate subheading after the introduction. After that, it is good to have a subheading titled 'Causal Composition'. It is better to have a short paragraph first, indicating there are two types of causal composition, namely, Weak Causal Composition and Strong Causal Composition. After that, the two types of composition can be described under subheadings. Biological simples and physical simples too may be presented under separate subheadings.
