Abstract:

In "Methods" it is better to give more information about sample size, sample number of per group (intervention and comparison groups), and also the method of analyzing data and used programs e.g. spss

It is better to add "Conclusion" part to abstract

Introduction:

There are newer references for using in introduction instead of old articles which has written in 2001, 2004, The authors can find many related newer studies on data bases.

Some sentences have no references. For instance: last sentence in paragraph 2: This is particularly important for the youth, who are especially vulnerable to mental illness, owing to changing socio-economic circumstances.

"APA" is a more preferable form of giving references

Methods:

There is no referring to including and excluding criteria

Table of intervention session details and the taught contents should be attached

The way of matching samples of intervention and comparison groups is not mentioned.

Discussion:

Discussion can be more expanded by using more studies

Limitation:

"limitation" part can have a dependent heading



This study includes dental student, not different study fields as a limitation for distributing the results to all healthcare students.
