

Review of: "A Case Study on Industry-Institute-Cooperation"

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I would consider this piece as a report than an academic article. As a report, it is a nice piece as it provides a brief background on the establishment of NITTTR in India and its role in developing industry-relevant curricula. It describes 2 cases offered by NITTTR Chennai: the cement industry and auto ancillary components industry. It provides a step-by-step account of the planning and execution process with these 2 cases. It highlights the success factors and lessons learned from these cases. This piece would benefit from specific details about the outcomes and impacts of these training programs on the cement industry and auto ancillary. For instance, opportunities and challenges mentioned are quite generic and it is not clear how they would address the institute's ability to undertake consultancy projects effectively. Other than description, I do not know what is the main purpose of this piece. I would either expand literature review or include that information in introduction; I find LR to be extremely brief without making any points. There should be details with specific examples, data, and case studies to support the claims made about the effectiveness of the training programs.

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
