- 1. The study of livelihood vulnerability is important, especially in the Mekong Delta (MRD) in Vietnam.
- 2. The title of the research article needs to be concise and precise.
- 3. The presentation of the problem is good, but the methodology lacks clarity.
- 4. Has a well-structured questionnaire been used for the study? If so, the data collected from the survey needs to be analyzed, and results need to be presented more systematically.
- 5. Apart from the seasonal calendar of activities undertaken by the communes and the extreme weather phenomena studied here, a very vague presentation of the level of the vulnerability of livelihood has been addressed. The author/authors could have attempted to construct livelihood vulnerability indices to analyse the vulnerability of households in the area.
- 6. The impact of unnatural factors on livelihood in the communes could have been studied by fitting regression models and by classifying the unnatural factors into social and economic factors.
- 7. Classification of the factors would improve the study of the impact of the factors contributing to vulnerability.
- 8. The model can either be represented pictorially or can be developed quantitatively by using multiple regression models.
- 9. Each model can be presented separately, and the pros and cons and the solution of each can be discussed.
