Data Analysis and Procedure—the procedure for data analysis lacks clarity and depth, focusing solely on describing statistical analysis instruments without adequate citations to support the methodological approach.

Results and Interpretation— the need to improve brevity and readability in our results and interpretations. Aim to highlight key points and constructs that are both interesting and meaningful within the context this study. Inappropriate to suggest the proposed framework here.

Policy and Managerial Implications—the current content in this section does not align with the focus of the paper. A more meaningful discussion would entail a thorough examination of the data analysis to summarise the findings effectively.

Conclusion and Recommendation—the conclusion lacks comprehensive discussion regarding the representation of the overall content of the paper, including objectives, literature review, and research methods.

References—exclude references that do not directly relate to the content of the paper to maintain relevance and focus.
