

Review of: "Studying the Level of Livelihood Vulnerability and the Necessity of the Work Developing a Farmhouse Economic Economic Model to Adapt to Climate Change in the Coastal Area of Ben Tre"

- 1. The abstract introduces too much research background and lacks a summary of research methods and conclusions.
- 2. The introduction of research methods in the paper is too simplistic. What are the contents of the questionnaire survey? Is the population participating in the questionnaire survey representative? How many samples are there? How many valid data were obtained?
- 3. Table 3.1 lacks necessary annotations" x" What does it represent? Is "plant color" a "plant specifications"?
- 4. The crop calendar in monthly units in Table 3.1 seems to be insufficient to illustrate the issue, as the impact of climate change on agricultural time, aquaculture, fisheries, and livestock farming may be shorter than a month.
- 5. Table 3.3 lacks necessary explanation. How is "Level of vulnerability of livelihood" determined? Data source? What does the size of a number represent?
- 6. The discussion and conclusion of the paper are lengthy, but slightly off topic. According to the title, the article needs to discuss in the discussion and conclusion section the consequences of not adjusting the economic model of farmhouses to adapt to climate change based on the vulnerability level of livelihoods in industries such as agriculture, animal husbandry, and fisheries in the research area, and what will happen after the adjustment.
