

Review of: "[Research Note] Long COVID in Mexico – Research Efforts"

This note is short and makes a point (the need to study Long COVID in Mexico and have treatment guides).

1. It would be useful if the authors pointed out the pathogenic mechanisms that have been suggested for Long COVID-19 like immune dysregulation/persisting immune response/ autoantibodies, persisting virus and dysbiosis, microangiopathy/cuagulopathy and abnormal neurological signalling. The authors basically center in the persisting inflammatory response and it is only vaguely stated in relation to risk factors like obesity and senescence.
2. The authors should improve their writing because several phrases have repeated words like:

“practice **guides** to **guide**”

“The **first** efforts provided the **first** description of symptoms”

“the **first** Mexican clinical practice guide, and we have made the **first** proposal”
3. The table is a good contribution as it summarizes work that has been published in the field, in Mexico. The age column should include some dispersion measure like standard deviation or range, the risk factor and symptom columns would benefit from including frequencies.
4. It is not clear from reading the note what would go into preparing a clinical practice guide for long COVID.
