Abstract: The abstract needs to be restructured.

- I think in the abstract, the authors don't need to discuss other countries like America and Europe. Better words are used in developed countries here. Rather, discuss one line about the study area.
- The second line of the abstract, "This may point to the fact that PFAS exposure in Abuja may not pose only localized risk but may progress to be a global risk," can be restructured as, "Since 91% of the population is unaware of the localized risks, sources, and health effects of these compounds, therefore, there is an emerging need to start raising awareness about these compounds."
- I am also surprised that 91% of the population is aware of these compounds, which means out of 10, only 1 person knows about PFAS. I think this disparity is because of the low number of respondents, i.e., 400 only. But I appreciate the efforts of the authors.

- Please add the citations (actual references) for this line in the introduction, "Studies have linked PFAS to various types
 of cancer; endocrine damage, reproductive system defects, and is potentially toxic to animals (Betts, 2007)."
