- 1. it would be better to mention about perception and attitude regarding intention and hesitancy in the introduction and the objectives.
- 2. It would be better to include the health belief model to assess the perception.
- 3. It would be better to explain how outcome variables that were found significant at p<0.05 were or were not associated with the perception and attitude about COVID-19 vaccine. see https://doi.org/10.3390/ijerph19052721
- 4. It would be better that the results mention about the association between knowledge, perception and attitude. It would be better to include the results of how it was found that "higher education" predicts the vaccine uptake or hesitancy.
- 5. It is not clear in the discussion how the outcome of the study explain the perception and hesitancy of attendant about COVID-19 vaccine.
- 6. There is no consistency between key issues found and the conclusion. No recommendation.
