Dear authors, thank you very much for submitting your article "Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) Interventions for People with Disabilities". In my point of view it is very valuable and profitable that you take up this topic and thus make a contribution to the successful participation of this group of people.

I would like to give you the following advice: The introduction prepares well for the expected contents. It would be desirable if you could cite and provide more evidence from studies, especially recent studies. The methodology still offers possibilities for optimisation. For example, you should change the search terms that were used for the literature search. It is also unclear how the screening of the articles was done. Here you should use a PRISMA flow chart. You state that you evaluated the contents of the identified literature using content analysis. This procedure should also be described transparently. What criteria, procedures, special features were there in the process here? Is there literature on the method used? This should be mentioned in a compulsory manner. The statistical evaluation is described in a comprehensible way. Within the discussion, I am surprised why little current literature is used to discuss the results. There is also a lack of discussion of your newly acquired findings. What do your results mean in relation to current scientific knowledge? The conclusions still seem loose with the previous results. You may be able to sharpen the conclusions if you reconsider the aims of the article.
