It is important for the author to revise the repetitive sentences within the manuscript. Additionally, the author should provide how One Health utilizes epidemiological data to develop various programs, including the prediction of disease outbreaks and vector control. Furthermore, the manuscript should address the involvement of policymakers in this context. The author should use GIS-based data to make or highlight infected areas in Indonesia as well as surroundings.
