Hence, the paper has the potential for acceptance. Following are specific remarks that must be changed significantly before the article may move forward for publication.

Title: Please offer a brief title.

Abstract: The abstract is properly covered, however, in the findings section, please exclude the publications referenced and avoid using the names of the spices more than once, followed by the use of scientific names.

Introduction: The introduction is relevant and theoretical in structure. However, the writers must be methodical in their addition to the literature in this field of study and keep it brief. References should not be quoted more than once and should not be mentioned after many sentences.

Please supply a table instead of paragraphs for statistical analysis.

Results and Discussion: To make it simpler and concise for readers to grasp, please include some graphics or tabular data

Conclusion: Is adequate.
