First of all, I can understand that the author's intention in writing this article is to help readers better understand the definition of social infrastructure. But the article also has some omissions. This article is a summary paper on the whole. The concept of social infrastructure is often confused in various fields (the terminology is controversial). The author tries to narrow the definition of social infrastructure to the undefined field of cyberspace. However, the author has not explained the specific value of using the term social infrastructure in various fields. The most important thing is that the research problem is not clearly stated and the term used to prove that social infrastructure is more suitable for the research method and process centered on cyberspace is too thin and unconvincing. Secondly, although the author mentioned that few scholars have studied the positive externalities of social infrastructure, the author also failed to explain the importance of studying social infrastructure to readers in the conclusion. Finally, my suggestion is that the abstract should briefly explain the definition of social infrastructure centered on cyberspace. The first paragraph of the introduction should add a reference to the "blue" infrastructure, and it is suggested that it should be mentioned in the same way as the "green" infrastructure. The analysis of the text is relatively weak, and it is suggested to put forward specific findings, and then draw academic and scientific conclusions.
