Dear Author,

When Qeios recommended this article to me, the title and abstract really appealed to me. I thought it was a meaningful topic.

I thought it would be an empirical analysis or qualitative analysis of the study. Regrettably, It actually looks more like a review article. The article cannot effectively prove the conclusions because of the missing research methodology.

The article describes seven areas in an attempt to present a full picture of the plight of higher education in Tanzania. My advice is that it is best not to try to analyze and solve all the problems in one study. Try to find a single point and derive how a learning theory can help improve the problem through empirical research, or quantitative research, etc.

My detailed comments are as follows:

- (1) The structure of the abstract is generally reasonable, summarizing the background, the object, and the main conclusions. However, the abstract has not elaborated on the research methodology because the full text lacks a research methodology. Please revise the abstract after revising the text. It is also advisable to avoid using words such as "this research", "this paper", etc. in the abstract.
- (2) When you get back to the proposal, please clearly highlight the research gap in the introduction. In additional, please avoid using "I".
- (3) The description of the concepts is more like a popular introduction. This is probably due to problems with the study design. It would make the topic clearer, if the theories most applicable to entrepreneurship education in Tanzania were retained and other theories were deleted.
- (4) The obvious problem of this paper is the lack of sufficient experimentation to demonstrate the conclusions. This makes the conclusion appear to be the author's experience rather than a rigorously derived and proven result.
- (5) Also, please see if there is more recent literature, which you could add.
- (6) Finally, I would like to emphasize again that I think this research topic is really relevant. It can present the peculiarities



of entrepreneurship education in Tanzania and also has implications for entrepreneurship education in other countries. I sincerely hope you can find a more focused point to conduct your research, get first-hand information and refine the process of analysis. I look forward to seeing your updated manuscript.
