After carefully reviewing your paper titled < Economic System Rationality Entropy setting for Kenya by Fiscal Policy, Job Re-assignment and Job Creation: Human Capital-based Resilience Indexing against China> I would like to provide some constructive feedback and suggestions to enhance the quality and readability of your work.

In this manuscript, you have effectively summarized and discussed the measurement of resilience using rational entropy in economic systems, as well as established the influence of existing economic driving forces on economic system entropy.

Furthermore, you have proposed a rationality matrix developed by Kirika which leads to the entropy-reason law. This contribution offers valuable insights into short-term fiscal policy actions aimed at reducing cognitive economic stress and economic system entropy through job creation and redistribution in Kenya compared with China.

Your research questions and objectives are clearly stated, presenting unique perspectives that are addressed using cutting-edge methods appropriate for this study. Additionally, you have conducted extensive experimental and analytical work within the scope of your thesis, providing robust support for your research conclusions.

However, while reading your paper, I noticed certain areas that require improvement in order to enhance its overall quality and level. Therefore, I would like to offer the following suggestions:

1. The structure, language usage, and grammar throughout the paper need further optimization to ensure clarity and comprehensibility for readers. It is recommended that each chapter be thoroughly revised to ensure fluency, relevance, logical flow between sections while correcting any spelling or grammatical errors present.
2. It is recommended to further elucidate the innovation of this paper. The articles assert that through job creation and redistribution, this paper effectively mitigates overall cognitive economic stress and reduces economic system entropy. However, when discussing the significance and value of the conclusion, it fails to explicitly highlight the profound impact of this research on Kenya's future economic development. Perhaps more deliberation would enhance its clarity.
3. Additionally, with regards to sample selection and data selection, consideration should be given as to whether using 2020 data for a 2023 submission may result in outdated or stale findings.

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
