

Review of: "A Case Study on Industry-Institute-Cooperation"

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The article addresses an important topic that will become even more important in the future. The reader is interested in finding out how the educational task was approached in specific cases and what experiences were made in the research process.

The SWOT analysis may be seen as a suitable tool. However, the selection of the criteria seems arbitrary, so that it is to be feared that a desired result is already anticipated with the selection alone. So, I recommend to explain more how the criteria were selected.

In the evaluation, the reader misses concrete references to the criteria guiding the analysis. Above all, there is a lack of descriptive statistics that would allow a better assessment of the successes of the participants and thus the strengths and weaknesses of methodological approaches. I recommend to make visible the logical correlations between the criteria of the SWOT analysis. I am sure that any statistics about the success of different didactical methods will be interesting for the readers.

When the evaluation is more concrete, then it will be easier to find in the discussion the reference to the state of the art. Then the conclusions will become more logical and informative, too.

In this article, the description of the results suffers from some short-comings. So, I suggest to streamline the correlation between method and results a bit more detailed.
