

Review of: "Development of Education for Sustainable Development Integrated Coastal Conservation Education Kit in Junior High Schools"

This is an interesting and simple manuscript on how to implement ESD applied to coastal conservation. However, this seems to be more a pilot study to explain how to produce the kit rather than to test the kit for its intended purpose, though some evaluation has been made.

With only 22 students, it is too few to reach good and reliable information for potential studies. Under this comment, I would emphasize the need to add "pilot study" to the title.

More than statistics, it would be important to understand how the students have changed their attitudes and care regarding coastal conservation. Do the authors follow the group?

The kit was elaborated by students under 7th grade; how did they react? Generally, under those ages, children start to get bored with this type of manual work.

Comparing with the previous studies developed under field work, how did you find (qualitatively/quantitatively) this education kit more feasible, effective, and appropriate? Are you intending to test this kit in younger/older students?
