Thanks to the authors who considered a problem-oriented and practical topic and chose it for their study. Epidemiological findings are critical in leading studies with the aim of risk assessment and management, particularly with a policy-making approach. The topic is attractive. The keywords seem to be missed. The introduction starts with a proper question about a challenge. The introduced link in the method section for the survey instrument is inaccessible. I suggest it be repaired. Also, I do not know the structure of the publisher/journal; however, it is suggested to keep a structured subtitle for each section (e.g., 1, 1. 1., 1. 1. 1., and so on). The constructive results and discussion seem to be informative based on the collected and analyzed data using interviews with the relevant expert panel. The findings of the present study are helpful and surely can be fundamental for future studies and development. For instance, it is suggested that the authors/future researchers consider these findings for the weighting and prioritizing of the performance indicators of an integrated health risk assessment tool based on epidemiological data.
