Even if your sample is considered small compared to all the countries analyzed, I recommend that you write this in a limitations section separate from the discussion and explain why the adversities about the sample. I am against this science that accuses who use a small sample to devalue an entire work. Of course, having a large sample when you work with quantitative methods is crucial, but sometimes we can't.

With that in mind, here are some suggestions:

- 1. Limitation Section;
- 2. In the participant's section, it would be interesting to report that the collection was carried out duringthe pandemic period (try to incorporate with the text below that you mention the restrictions). I understand entirely the low sample, I did work with two countries in the same period, and I had a low sample as well;
- 3. I don't particularly like so many tables, and maybe I would make two bar graphs to explain some contexts;
- 4. Why not separate the countries by Eastern and Western or Continents? Since we have very different aspects between cultures, laws, and consumption;
- 5. I suggest removing samples with less than 10 participants, and you could propose another qualitative study with this smaller sample (Just to avoid interference in the sample).
- 6. It is essential to explain the motivation part better, as it appears in the title.
