Authors need to address the following issues:

The study is based only on a selected sample of students, researchers, and faculty of the social sciences. The science faculty is not included in this study. So, authors may consider sampling from the students, faculty, and others from science schools also to have a comparative analysis. Moreover, the study is based on a single university. Perhaps it would be better if the researchers could include samples from a few other universities in Iran as well.

The literature review section requires refinement. From the relevant literature, research questions should be drawn.

Moreover, authors should choose appropriate analytical framework(s) that best align(s) with the research objectives. It will help to set the context for a comprehensive analysis of academic dishonesty. Few relevant analytical frameworks, for example, 'rational choice theory', 'social learning theory', and so on, perhaps fit into the objectives of this study. So, author(s) may find a suitable analytical framework related to their research questions and objectives.
