I recommend refining this article in the following ways before considering it final:

- If the authors want to discuss implications for both education and the medical field, should the paper's title and abstract be edited accordingly? Or should the references to the medical field in the manuscript be edited out?
- This paper would benefit from being in greater conversation with current scholarly literature on this topic. It primarily relies on Prensky's seminal work from about two decades ago, with few major references to newer ideas. I suggest incorporating some of Eszter Hargittai's work on this topic and/or research on TPACK (or similar frameworks).
- Are both "digital Neanderthal" and "digitally illiterate" needed? Both terms seem to refer to the same thing, and the authors use them interchangeably.
- I suggest adding an explicit call for empirical work to support the authors' assertions.
