

Review of: "Perceptions of Academic Dishonesty: Insights from the University of Tehran"

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Important work, I would have liked a bit more of a comprehensive theoretical exploration of the problem from the outset, with more evidence for some of the assumptions made around the prevalence of the problem, etc. I also felt there were opportunities to engage the reader with richer descriptions. For example, when you speak about Iran as a culture of knowledge, etc., you might have quoted a poet or philosopher or something like that. The data was good but, again, the analysis might have been more rigorous and questions explored in more depth. Overall, this is a timely and extremely relevant exploration for the current intellectual climate internationally!!
