- 1. Title of the study focuses on only the Invalid Vaccine doses but introduction also tackles about valid vaccination schedule. A revision of the title is suggested to reflect all the variables included in the study.
- 2. It is suggested that researchers provide an operational definition of invalid doses.
- 3. The methodology does not provide specifics and lacks several sections. For example, there is no discussion on the research instrument used, inclusion and exclusion criteria of the respondents, sampling technique, and detailed data collection procedure.
- 4. The qualitative analysis done by the researchers does not adhere to the standard procedure of presentation of results.
- 5. Discussion of results is very limited. There are several findings that were not presented in the discussion and explained.
- 6. Overall, the format of the entire paper is not scientific. A revision is suggested to meet the requirements of a scholarly written manuscript.
