Thank you for inviting me to review this article. The study raises very pertinent issues regarding invalid vaccine doses. Invalid vaccine dose is a significant contributor to vaccine wastage which eventually leads to a significant financial loss considering the costs of vaccines. The authors may however need to improve on the following:

1. The title does not reflect the methods used in the study especially the qualitative component.
2. The aspect of invalid vaccine doses needs to be defined early enough in the background, it takes time for the reader to understand what is regarded as invalid vaccine dose.
3. The methodology section isn't clear on how the participants were chosen for a qualitative data collection; how were they obtained? was there any categorization based on some demographic characteristics?
4. The result section does not reflect the qualitative component of this study.
