Thank you for inviting me to review this article. The study raises very pertinent issues regarding invalid vaccine doses. Invalid vaccine dose is a significant contributor to vaccine wastage which eventually leads to a significant financial loss considering the costs of vaccines. The authors may however need to improve on the following:

- 1. The title does not reflect the methods used in the study especially the qualitative component.
- 2. The aspect of invalid vaccine doses needs to be defined early enough in the background, it takes time for the reader to understand what is regarded as invalid vaccine dose.
- 3. The methodology section isn't clear on how the participants were chosen for a qualitative data collection; how were they obtained? was there any categorization based on some demographic characteristics?
- 4. The result section does not reflect the qualitative component of this study.

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
