First of all, thanks to the authors for sharing their experience.

The article is well written with an excellent bibliographical analysis.

On the contrary, the contents are poor and describe an idea (as many can have) but with little practical and clinical implications as there is only one case and also with not very detailed iconography.

An immediate post-treatment is certainly impressive but is not significant as it is important to see a follow-up over time. 3 months is the minimum to see stabilization of the threads results.

At a greater distance they would also be more interesting in an analysis of the materials. The main criticism of PDO threads is that they have a short lifespan. Could other threads with greater durability, in polylactic acid or caprolactone for example, be used? Currently this article does not bring anything new to the clinical practice of a thread user who should dive into the void to try the proposed technique

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
