4. **Specific Examples:** The article focuses heavily on India and specific companies like Byju's, which might limit the global applicability of the conclusions. Including more examples from different regions would be helpful.
5. **Citations and References:** Some sections could benefit from more empirical data and references to previous studies to support the claims made.

### Use of English Language:

- Generally clear and understandable, but some sentences could be revised for improved precision and smoothness.
- Examples of phrases to review include "a mushroom of research articles," which could be more clearly expressed as "a plethora of research articles."
- The use of the term "myriad" is appropriate but could be replaced with "various" or "numerous" for better fluency in some contexts.

### Revision Suggestions:

- **Concision:** Reduce the length of repetitive sections and focus on key points to maintain reader engagement.
- **Linguistic Precision:** Review some sentences to improve the clarity and fluency of the English language.
- **Balanced Argumentation:** Treat the cyclical pandemic hypothesis with more caution and provide a balanced discussion.
- **Variety of Examples:** Include examples from different regions of the world for a more global perspective.
- **Empirical Support:** Add more empirical data and references to strengthen the claims.

With these revisions, the article can become more impactful and authoritative.
