I found this article informative and with valuable novel information for readers. But overall content of this article does not reflect the article title. The present article can be further improved by incorporating the following suggestions,

1. Consider modifying the article title.
2. The abstract warrants further modification to reflect the subject matter.
3. The introduction can be modified to provide general information about the SARS-CoV-2 infection process, some details about vaccination basics, and available COVID-19 vaccines.
4. The table of classification of individuals based on their susceptibility to viral infection is informative and impactful. Consider explaining this table in detail in the main text.
5. Though some SARS-CoV-2-positive individuals survive without vaccination, this does not rule out the impact of vaccination. This is not the reason vaccination should be refused. The vaccination may not completely protect from SARS-CoV-2 infection but play a role in disease severity.
6. I like the idea that vaccination should come with a package to follow up the seroconversion to detect IgG and IgA. Thus, we can avoid repeated or booster dosing.
