This is good academic work that can merit newspaper publication on the social and cultural dynamics of Obaship in Yorubaland. Although the focus is on Akokoland, it is more of an exposé on Yoruba traditional politics and leadership. The introduction is too heavy. What is submitted as theoretical frameworks is a literature review. This is not acceptable. The research methodology is missing. This should be added to improve the work and help the readers understand the basis of the work and the conclusion. The concept of KARAOLE was explained without any critical inputs by the author. On the whole, I think the work is good but needs structural adjustment to meet basic academic writing standards.
