

# Review of: "Spirituality of Pilgrims on the Camino de Santiago: Existential Questions and the Meaning of Life"

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The article is well-written, uses a reasonably relevant bibliography for the theoretical chapter, and has interesting conclusions. The great weakness of the article is the methodology, as it does not conduct fieldwork and uses ready-made narrations mainly in the Slovenian language. The selection of the cases used as sources needs to be adequately justified. Nothing is expressed about the common characteristics or dissimilar characteristics of the narrators. He uses, for example, Shirley MacLaine's book as one of his sources without inquiring about the literary styles and aims of each author of his secondary sources.

She may appeal to other studies already done on the subject (the 2008 text by the author Elena Zapponi, *Pray with the Feet*, published in Italian, comes to my mind at this point). However, there must be an academic bibliography that collects systematic research with defined criteria for selecting the sample.
