

Review of: "The Imperative of a Comprehensive One Health Approach for Mosquito-Borne Disease Control in Indonesia"

The paper does not discuss what has caused the current malaria vector interventions in Malaysia to fail. The problems causing the drawbacks are not discussed to provide a justification for the One Health Comprehensive concept. The section on 'Interconnectedness of Human, Animal, and Environmental Health' is well written, but some important clarifications need to be made. It does not explain how mosquitoes transmit the disease from animals to humans and how animals play a role in mosquito vector prevalence. You mean to say that even if you protect humans in the domestic sector with ITNs, etc., mosquitoes can transmit from other habitats such as animals and breeding grounds where the animals are, as well as from animals in the wild. If so, then this is not articulated well.

However, this proposed concept is very good.

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
