- 1. The topic of the study is very relevant to the public health issue; however, the time frame of the data was 13-15 years (2009-2011). This could limit the current relevance of the findings.
- 2. It covered only two years. This may limit the ability of the study to capture trends or changes in anemia-related outcomes over time.
- 3. The study relies on hospital records, which may not capture certain factors related to anemia in pregnancy. The quality of data depends on the accuracy and completeness of the hospital records in a developing country such as Burkina Faso.
- 4. While the study identifies some factors associated with unfavorable outcomes, it may not cover all potential variables influencing anemia in pregnancy in lower settings.
