

Review of: "Honorary Authorship in Biomedical Journals: The Endless Story"

This short note presents the position of the authors related to honorary authorship and ethical behavior of researchers in biomedical journals.

To summarize, the main statements of the authors are:

Furthermore, given the current availability of large repositories of scientific papers, a more extensive data analysis to support and validate the hypotheses of the authors is required.

Finally, it is not clear if the position of the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) is also the position of the authors. I think so, but this has to be explicitly declared.

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
