There are various definitions of metabolic syndrome in the introduction. These definitions should be mentioned. The importance of metabolic syndrome, which is becoming a growing problem for adolescents, should be emphasized more strikingly.

Criteria for inclusion in the study should be written more clearly.

The tables are very detailed and crowded. If more summary tables were made, the tables could be read and understood more clearly. If researchers want to describe results this way, there is no need to change it. However, it should be known that tables tire the reader.

It should be further supported with literature in the discussion section. In this respect, it is recommended to benefit from the article mentioned below.
