## Reviewer comments

Overall, this article is interesting through the presentation of the author who is neat, systematic, and uses multidisciplinary studies, however, the following points need to complement the presentation of the article so that it is more concise, lighter and makes it easier for readers with various disciplinary backgrounds to understand and can be consumed by academics:

- a. Abstracts of more than 500 words need to be reduced to a maximum of 300 words, while maintaining the presentation of the essence of the article
- b. Keywords of more than 50 words, the maximum number of keywords that should be listed is no more than 10 words that are very related to the terminology of the issue being studied
- c. The author needs to confirm the type of research method that has been carried out, by referring to two methods that are commonly known in the research field, namely quantitative or qualitative or does the author use a mix of the two methods
- d. It needs to be emphasized at the end of the article's conclusion regarding recommendations that are operational in nature and implementable which can be referred to by related parties so as to produce programs that are sustainable in addressing solutions to specific targets
