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- You use the phrase 'Baumol's cost disease' too many times throughout the text, and it makes it harder to read. It is better to use the acronym BCD where necessary.
- The final paragraph of the Introduction is detailed and long. It would be better if you summarized it.
- In the literature review, where you mentioned over-reliance on tourism, you might address the island economies. There are many studies on the tourism-led growth hypothesis on islands.
- I think the Theoretical Framework should come before the Literature Review so that readers can understand what you are trying to analyze.
- The literature seems to be well-organized, yet it needs to be enriched by some other studies revealing the relationship between the variables you selected, and it will also deepen your discussion at the end of the paper.
- The typo in Title 5.2 needs to be corrected.
- The methodology seems powerful and accurate.
- Overall, I think it is a well-organized paper. Congratulations to the author.
