The article is easy and fluent to read. It presents a 'somewhat' technical model in a simple, clear and succinct manner. I think this makes the article very accessible to people of different disciplines – seeing that the COM-B model is a transdisciplinary model. However, there is room for further improving the article. Some suggestions are listed below.

- 1. The introduction is a bit too short. It will be great to present examples of some disciplines that have made use of the model and how the model has been applied in these disciplines.
- 2. In the section, COM-B constructs, it will also be great to explain why the different versions exist, and to give practical examples of how the different versions have been applied. This will serve to enlighten readers on the applicability of the model and bring the model to life in the mind of readers. It will also help the authors better achieve one of the aims of the paper which is to explain why there are different versions of the model.

Summarily, the reasons for the different versions of the model are not quite clear from the article. Best wishes.

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
