Table 1: The column of fathers is still confusing; meanwhile the target population were mothers.

Table 2. The issue of condition of child's vaccine card and vaccination card available

- The first one card given and available or not.
- The second one card available yes or no

This information is the same, unless you remove the availability on the first one.

Table 3. Look at the narratives, somewhere it is said the responded did not know of providing OPV with 95,39%, and about 55% had knowledge of timing of 2<sup>nd</sup> measles dose.

This table is not clear whether is reporting the positives or negatives.
