

Review of: "Beyond the Fear of Artificial Intelligence and Loss of Job: a Case for Productivity and Efficiency"

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Interesting essay that essentially expresses the fear of our fellow human beings, particularly those who work in labor fields where there are already examples of incorporating AI in routine intellectual and manufacturing tasks, of losing their jobs because they would increase the productivity and efficiency of what they do.

{{There is a common and anonymous phrase that says the human who is afraid of being displaced by a machine with AI and does nothing to avoid it deserves to be displaced.}}

- The brief historical introduction to the development of AI is accurate.
- Conveniently explains the meaning of AI; likewise, the types: Narrow or Weak; General or Strong; and Super Artificial.
- It also describes the relationships between AI and the modern economy, although in terms of health, it does so superficially.
- In the security area, it focuses only on cybersecurity, which seems appropriate to me given the large number of thefts and intrusions into business computer systems and personal computers.
- Regarding AI as a cause of labor instability, the fear is fully justified given the changes already observed so far, especially in manufacturing work.
- Now, with strong AI and the so-called "Genetics and Generative" of language..., there is a fear that it will displace
 some professionals (lawyers, for example) and interfere in artistic activities such as literature, architecture, music, or
 the creative work of painters (DALL-E2).
- It seems to me that the push of Chat GPT and DALL-E2 type AI will lead many professionals who feel their disciplinary field invaded to seek another type of preparation, developing new capabilities and expanding their creativity (artists) within the same field of advanced computing, or to be trained in other disciplines, or even to generate new disciplinary fields.

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
