The manuscript seems to be at a very preliminary stage with a discussion of already reported information. There is almost no additional contribution in terms of research work and results that are included in the discussion by the authors.

In my view, more surveying needs to be done by the authors to conclude on the farm economics of the selected crops. The consultations with farmers & other concerned bodies, as mentioned by the authors, may be evaluated to understand the factors that may affect the farm economics. Accordingly, the authors may come up with their own methodology to predict the economics of not only the selected crops, but to apply the same method to other crops that are being considered as superfoods, for example, jackfruit.

Hence, more research on the subject is needed to be done before further consideration.
